Re: Environmental Assessment and Clearance Certificate for the Ashton Ridge Golf Course Windfarm, Lots 31 & 32, concession 7 and Lots 29 & 30, Concessions 7 & 8, Township of East Luther Grand Valley, Dufferin County, Ontario (the "Windfarm")

We are in receipt of a letter from Dr. Ron Williamson of Archaeological Services Inc. ("ASI"), dated February 1, 2007, in which Mr. Williamson states that "it is unlikely that any First Nation archaeological sites that may be located within the project area will prove to have been occupied by the direct ancestors of the Huron-Wendat people today."

We acknowledge that a Stage 2 archaeological assessment is being scheduled for the Windfarm. We request that the Huron-Wendat be notified once the Stage 2 archaeological assessment is scheduled and reserve our right to attend at the Windfarm during the course of the Stage 2 archaeological assessment as well as to receiving a copy of any report generated from the assessment. Subject to the results of the Stage 2 archaeological assessment, the Huron-Wendat Nation reserves all of its rights.

We can advise that the Huron-Wendat Nation will be providing any future comments regarding the project, if any, through the Founding First Nations Circle. At this time, it appears most likely the Huron-Wendat Nation will be deferring to the Mohawk Six Nations of Brantford in this matter. At this time, the Huron-Wendat are satisfied with the steps taken thus far and look forward to receiving further reports over the coming months.
